Transition



What is transition?

Transition is the process by which children enter our school, move from year group to year group and finally leave us and move on to secondary school.

Why is transition important?

Whether children are starting school for the first time or moving classes within the same school, parents and children may have concerns and worries. Those worries are often about the unknown and effective transition will ensure you have ample opportunity to ask questions and prepare for the changes ahead. When transition is done well, children will retain their self-confidence, self-esteem and continue to make good progress. Parents will also feel well informed and able to support their child's development at home.

How do we manage transition?

On July Thursday 6th 2023, the children will take part in a transition day. During this day, there will be a focus on developing the beginnings of relationships with staff and pupils that will be in the class next year. As part of this each child will:

- Be introduced to this year's transition theme 'Making a Difference' through the story 'The Planet in a Pickle Jar'.
- Find out about their Team and the learning that will take place next year.
- Take part in activities that support staff in understanding each pupil in their class.
