Red Nose Day 2024



Nursery News

As you will be aware, we have been trialling a limited number of 30 hours places in our nursery during this last Autumn term. This has proved to be very popular and has been a great success so we will be continuing with the current arrangements going forward. She will be really missed but I am sure you will all join me in wishing her a healthy and happy maternity leave, when her family's bundle of joy decides to joint the world! We will keep you up to date with any developments as soon as we hear! No doubt baby Firth will be in Park Street very soon to meet the TEAM (especially Mrs Firth's beloved Team LF)!

With Mrs Firth leaving for a year, we are pleased to confirm that for the foreseeable, a lady called Miss A Robertson will be joining the Park Street team to cover her in class. I am sure you will all join me in warmly welcoming her to the Team. Mrs Greenhalgh and Mrs Sykes will remain in Team LF as well. Miss Robertson is in school this week working with Mrs Firth on Wednesday afternoon as part of her transition and we will also be making appointments in the first weeks back to ensure we have everything in place for specific children and their families.

Mrs Firth being on maternity leave means we have a LOT of leadership responsibilities to cover too:

- Miss E Overton will take over as PE Leader and work alongside Mr Smith (Sports Coach)

- Mr Davison will continue as Computing Leader (a role which he has alongside Mrs Firth)
- Mr Davison will also be taking on the role of School Council Leader in Mrs Firth's absence.

New Teaching Assistant joins Team AF and JF

This Monday (18th March) we welcome Miss P Exley to the staff team! She will be working predominantly as Teaching Assistant in Team AF and also work within Team JF to provide additional support and intervention for the boys and girls in KS1. I am sure you will all join me in warmly welcoming her to the staff team.

Miss Rowson – Cover Supervisor

Miss Rowson has recently been appointed as internal Cover Supervisor. She will continue to be based in Team AF, with Miss Exley above. She will cover Mr Fidment when he is out of class on his AHT Inclusion (SENDCo) role.

I have also begun teaching in Team AF on a Thursday, to provide additional time for Mr Fidment to complete his SENDCo role. Please note that SEND meetings will need to be on these days predominantly, so school and parents will have to work together to make these happen as best we can.

Social Media

I hear that social media is a great tool for keeping in contact with friends and family and for sharing good, positive news. However, this last week I have been disheartened that we have boys and girls, specifically in KS2, who have been subject to inappropriate content whilst using Apps such as WhastApp and Snap Chat. Please can the school community ensure that if their children are on such Apps, then they are supervised and that their phones are checked regularly. Could I please re-iterate, if you are upset with any school matters, as a parent, please can I ask that you follow the correct procedures and either phone the school, catch a member of SLT on the drive or make use of our drop ins, to discuss any unrest. Sharing such information on social media, unfortunately, displays inaccurate information and can often scaremonger other parents. I would much prefer for parents to have accurate details and perceive the school in the correct light – which is nothing other than supportive – ever. It is disheartening and can impact on staff morale when incorrect and unjustified comments are made about the school and against the staff who work so hard to make it a caring, supportive and lovely place to attend. It would be dreadful to lose amazing staff members because of parents being perceived as bad-mouthing individuals and their action – this is not fair.

Attendance and Punctuality

As a school, you know we are always keen for our children to attend well and be here on time, every single day. This is a life skill and we truly believe that if the children learn to take this seriously now, then this will only ever help them in their futures when in Secondary School (where there is zero tolerance of such), in further education or in their place of work.

Children's attendance is reviewed weekly by our Attendance Lead, Mrs Green in liaison with Mrs Dabbs who processes daily attendance. Every week she liaises with Mrs Mason (PSA) to discuss each of their case-loads, as quite often than not, their roles can overlap. Every other week, I monitor attendance with Mrs Green too. Our school Governor, Mrs Chavan, is also involved, as well as our EWO, David Scarth. As you can read, a whole attendance team works tenaciously to make sure this is a priority for the school community. I know a lot of parents, who always get their child to school on time and every single day, are really thankful for this approach. It also contributes to robust safeguarding procedures.

As part of these internal opportunities to monitor attendance and punctuality, we review each child and their attendance, discuss any concerns and reasons for absence and decide on a way forward for the child and family. This could be:

- no further action, as reasons for absence / odd lateness is understandable and there is a good enough reason for it. These would be shared, discussed and understood.
- in other circumstances, attendance may be strong, but punctuality really not so strong, so we would need to explore reasons for this, to see if we could help to improve matters for the child / family.
- in others, both attendance and punctuality may need addressing.

For the latter two, we would always try to communicate our concerns either in a phone call, a letter home or an invitation for parents to come in to school for an 'Internal School Attendance Panel' meeting and discuss the situation and support with next steps. The idea is to arrive at a positive outcome for the child, the family and the school. We always intervene with conversations and letters as a first port of call, to make you aware of our concerns and then a meeting if there is no improvement (or things continue).

Our whole ethos, as a staff team, is to discuss and offer support where we can. I am a big believer that NO school is perfect, but we ALWAYS TRY as a school. If you have seen the school portrayed negatively for our tenacious approach to ensuring good attendance and punctuality, I hope this helps to clear matters up! We follow our Trust's policies well and receive positive feedback from the wider Trust team for our efforts and results and we hope these efforts prepare our children for a bright future.
