School events this week

On Monday afternoon, Years 5 and 6 enjoyed a visit from Andrew Barnaby, Barnsley's Cohesion and Prevent Officer. He visited to talk about the Prevent Strategy, at a child level. Parents were informed about this before-hand. The children enjoyed the presentation from Andrew and learnt lots about how they need to be very careful when online using devices, as this is a key way in which extremists may attempt to radicalise others. They also had the opportunity to run through the age restrictions on various Apps and games. It was staggering to learn how much the children know and understand, but also worrying that a lot of children seemed to be on Apps meant for older boys and girls. Please do try and follow this up with your child at home and ensure they are completely safe online. Nursery at WSPS

We currently have places available in our wonderful teacher-led nursery provision for an immediate start. We offer free 15-hour sessions through either a morning or afternoon place from the term after your child's third birthday. Applications can be made once your child has turned two and they will be added to our waiting list. School Notices

New Reading Rewards – as you know, Park Street is very passionate about reading – we want all learners to be super proficient in reading at the earliest stage possible, so that they can become amazing writers and learn all about the world around them, whatever subject this might be in! From September, we will be introducing a new reward system for reading at home called 'Starbooks'...watch this space for more information! In short:

Children will still continue to have their diaries stamped daily and once they get 10 stamps, they can put a star on their reward card which is kept in class on a display. Then the following rewards:

50 stamps - bookmark and certificate

100 stamps - bronze lapel star pin

150 - biscuits, brew and books reading event

200 - silver lapel star pin

250 - authors, artists and appetisers event

300 - gold lapel star pin

Ice Lollies – many thanks for all of your support with the WPSP Group Ice Lolly sales this June. They have managed to raise a brilliant £300! The children have absolutely LOVED their lollies and it has provided a brilliant opportunity for them to queue, communicate their order and interact with adults! Thank you WPSPS Parental Group for giving up your free time for our ice-lolly munchers!

Prime – I am sure you are all aware of the recent drink craze ‘Prime’, which is promoted by Apps such as TikTok etc. A lot of children in school have been talking about the drink over the previous months. Whilst it is not our role to tell parents how they should parent, we wanted to make sure you were all aware of the drink and have some understanding of what it is.

Through Google research, we have found that the drink is not suitable for children under 15 years of age. Whilst it is stated that they do not have caffeine in them, they have a third more Vitamin A than the daily recommended amount for children (too much Vitamin A is toxic for the body) and they have a level of sweetener within them that is likely to cause a laxative effect on children. A number of children have been seen drinking this before and after school, which caused us a little concern given the information above. WPSPS only operates a ‘water bottle’ policy – please ensure Prime is never sent in to school and please avoid using Prime bottles as your child’s actual water bottle.



‘Thinking Differently’ – Mr Fidment (AHT for Inclusion), will be sending out a ‘Thinking Differently’ flier soon, to advertise the parenting course he will be running in the Autumn term. This course is designed for all parents, but especially parents who have children who suffer with communication and interaction difficulties. These children may have a confirmed diagnosis of ASD or ADHD, for example, or you as a family may be on the pathway to gaining a diagnosis. You may be a parent who struggles with your child’s behaviour at home and suspect you struggle as they may have a difficulty in this area. Please watch out for the new dates and let Mr Fidment know if you would like to attend. Mr Fidment follows Barnsley LA’s SCI Team materials for this, but is equally well trained in behaviour management as our SENDCo and Behaviour Lead and may be able to offer some help, advice and knowledge.
