

WOMBWELL PARK STREET PRIMARY SCHOOL RISK ASSESSMENT & REOPENING ACTION PLAN FROM SEPTEMBER 2020

Numbers for Reopening September 2020

In the 'Guidance for full opening of schools' (2.7.20), the DfE has requested that:

'Given the improved position, the balance of risk is now overwhelmingly in favour of children returning to school. For the vast majority of children, the benefits of being back in school far outweigh the very low risk from Coronavirus (COVID-19), and this guidance explains the steps schools need to take to reduce the risks still further. As a result, we can plan for all children to return and start to reverse the enormous costs of missed education. This will be an important move back towards normal life for many children and families'

The guidance makes up a PHE endorsed 'system of control' which when implemented in line with a revised risk assessment, the measures create an 'inherently safer environment for children and staff where the risk of transmission of infection is substantially reduced'.

As such, when school reopens to all children in September 2020, the school numbers are expected to be as follows:

It is important to note that, due to sharing the same staff members, Morning and Afternoon Nursery will be counted as one bubble.

Initially, each of these teams will be classed as one 'bubble'. As time goes on, and as further guidance is introduced, there may be opportunity for 'double bubbles' which will allow two bubbles to work together and work in a way similar to the way our school normally runs.

Numbers for Reopening 5th January 2021 for Children of Key Workers and Those Identified as Vulnerable

In R and R/1 the number of pupils in these bubbles will be capped at 15. For the other pupils in Y1 – Y6 their bubbles will be capped between 15 and 18 depending on space available and pupils ability to socially distance.

Whole School Risk Assessment for the planned re-opening of school September 2020 - 2021 (updated regularly)

Systems of Control:

This is the set of actions schools must take. They are grouped into 'prevention' and 'response to any infection' and are outlined in more detail in the sections below. Guidance May 2021 states that:

'If you follow the systems of controls, you will effectively reduce risks in your setting and create an inherently safer environment.'

Prevention:

- 1) minimise contact with individuals who are required to self-isolate by ensuring they do not attend school
- 2) ensure face coverings are used in recommended circumstances
- 3) ensure everyone is advised to clean their hands thoroughly and more often than usual
- 4) ensure good respiratory hygiene for everyone by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach
- 5) maintain enhanced cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often, using standard products such as detergents
- 6) consider how to minimise contact across the site and maintain social distancing wherever possible
- 7) keep occupied spaces well-ventilated

In specific circumstances

- 8) ensure individuals wear the appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) where necessary
- 9) promote and engage in asymptomatic testing, where available

Response to any infection:

- 10) promote and engage with the NHS Test and Trace process
- 11) manage and report confirmed cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) amongst the school community
- 12) contain any outbreak by following local health protection team advice.

We would encourage all individuals to take a PCR test if advised to do so. A remote learning plan will be implemented for those isolating. They will however be asked to take a Lateral Flow Test/ PCR test before returning to school.
