School events this week

This week in our Monday assembly for Years 1 – 6 we learnt about the significant person that is King Charles III, using our *Little People, Big Dreams* book collection in school. This was on the back of the Trooping the Colour parade, the previous weekend, to celebrate his birthday. The children were really knowledgeable about the life of King Charles, showing they have remembered their learning well from the work we did around the time of the Coronation. We did learn, however, that King Charles III is an avid artist, can play



three instruments (Cello, Trumpet and Piano) and has a degree from a British University!

I believe passionately that everyone has a particular God-given ability.

We looked at some of his famous quotes too and discussed what these suggested about the type of person he is too.

Nursery at WPSPS

We currently have places available in our wonderful teacher-led nursery provision for an immediate start. We offer free 15-hour sessions through either a morning or afternoon place from the term after your child's third birthday. Applications can be made once your child has turned two and they will be added to our waiting list. This is the perfect way to prepare your child for full time school by enabling them to be familiar with the routines, activities, staff and peers and therefore enable a flying start to their learning journey.

School Notices

Items from home – there has been a recent rise in children bringing things from home in to school. This may be caps for the warm weather, necklaces or toys from home. If items need to be brought in to school (eg caps for the warm weather) then please ensure these are not expensive caps. We would hate for any caps to be accidentally damaged or to get lost. Equally, children should not be wearing necklaces, especially sentimental ones of expensive ones as again, it is a school of 347 children and sometimes things can get misplaced and lost. We would hate for children to be upset due to this. Toys and fluffy cuddly toys should not be brought from home unless this is stipulated in a child's Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).

Bottom gate – once again, we request that anyone accessing the school site at drop off and collection time, ensure they open the gate, drive through it, close it and lock it back up again with the designated lock. If this is left open, which it is being, then unfortunately some parent / carers try to get through and this is making the school site even busier. This does not support school with our robust health, safety and safeguarding procedures. Please, lock the gate.

Summer Fayre – a quick reminder that it is our school's Summer Fayre on Friday 30th June 2023, at 1.30pm start. We look forward to seeing you all there. Please, whilst you are there, do pass on your thanks to the small but amazing group of parents that have helped to organise the event and the parents who have volunteered to hold a stall for us, as well as our very own Mrs Hitchens who has helped the group put on this amazing afternoon for the children! We hope they have fun!

You will be required to sign your child(ren) out from their classroom doors from 1.30pm, when the gates will be opened. If you wish for your child to be signed out by a Child Minder, then please let your child's class teacher know these arrangements before Friday. Let's hope for a sunny day!
