## Message from Mrs Lawson-continued...

#### National tests for Years 1, 2, 4 and 6 2019-20—IMPORTANT DATES TO NOTE!

Already staff and children are working hard to ensure they are preparing for their end of year statutory tests in Years 1, 2, 4 and 6. I would like to explain what each of these tests are and when they will be taking place.

**Firstly,** many of you will be aware that Year 2 and Year 6 children nationally have to sit their 'Statutory Assessment Tests', commonly knows as SATs in May each year—this applies to our current Year 2 and Year 6 children in Teams AC, CT and LL.

The dates for these assessment are set by the Government and therefore have to be rigidly stuck to. We ask that if your child is in these two year groups then you MUST ensure 100% attendance during these testing times:

Year 2 children: will be sitting their SATS throughout the month of May.

**Year 6 children:** will be sitting their SATs throughout the week commencing **Monday 11th May 2020** (Monday—Thursday inclusive).

**Secondly,** our Year 1 children also have to sit their 'Phonics Screening Check' (PSC) at the end of Year 1. This will take place during the week commencing **Monday 8th June 2020.** The dates for this assessment are set by the Government also and therefore have to be rigidly stuck to. We ask that if your child is in Year 1 then you MUST ensure 100% attendance during these testing times.

This also applies to children who are currently in Year 2, who did not pass their Phonics Screening Check when they were in Year 1, as they will be re-sitting the Check.

**Thirdly,** our Year 4 children will now be required to take their 'Multiplication Tables Check', a new initiative introduced by the Government. This will take place during a **three week window from Monday 8th June 2020**. The dates for these assessment are set by the Government and therefore have to be rigidly stuck to. We ask that if your child is in Year 4 then you MUST ensure 100% attendance during these three weeks of testing times.

Should you have already booked any holidays / absences from school during these times then please begin to liaise with school regarding the dates your child will be away from school, so as teachers may be able to plan for this and ensure their tests are administered at convenient times to school and yourselves, within the testing windows. This would be an absolute last resort; it is important that your child's testing periods are as calm as possible for them so as they can do the best for themselves and our school.

#### Parking, Council and a request for a School Crossing Control Warden

As always, parking at Park Street remains an issue. We have received a number of comments and emails regarding the varied parking issues we have and I have assured members of our school and local community that I would express their thoughts and opinions and encourage everyone to think carefully about where they park.

**Poplar Road and Hallam Close:** residents continue to find parking at drop off and pick up an issue on this small road. The Council have provided advice and in the past the Police have also issued letters regarding this. Please try to find an alternative place to park, or at least park with due care and attention to those who live there e.g. don't double park, don't park over drives or make it a challenge for residents to get off their property.

Parking at the bottom of the drive: please note that there should be NO VEHICLES parked up at the bottom of the school drive at any time, especially at drop off and pick up times. Road markings confirm this, but also please show acknowledgement to the fact that parking here causes serious concerns to parents who have children walking down the drive. It makes the risk to children and their families far too great—SAFEGUARDING THEM MATTERS!

## New Leave of Absence Policy

Leave of absence for holidays taken during term time are unauthorised by school unless there are 'exceptional circumstances'. (Each case is processed on an individual case by case basis). Parents need to complete a leave of absence form at least two weeks in advance of the holiday and applications are then processed and may result in a Penalty Notice being issued by the Local Authority.

Parents are informed of a revised Code of Conduct for the issuing of Penalty Notices resulting from a leave of absence. The following criteria are <u>no longer</u> taken into account:

- previous or current percentage attendance
- previous periods of leave of absence
- leave of absences taken in the first term
- exams and assessments
- Employer's letter(s)
- school attendance target

Where possible, holidays should be taken during school holiday periods and not term time to avoid missed education. Following an unauthorised holiday, parents will also receive a letter from school informing of the impact of the holiday on the child's percentage attendance.

Under the new Code, Penalty Notices can be issued if **any** of the following three conditions applies:

- A pupil has accrued five or more consecutive days of unauthorised leave of absence (holiday in term time)
- If issued due to sporadic unauthorised absences, then, other than in specific circumstances, the liable parent/carer will receive a formal warning of the possibility of a Penalty Notice being issued and be given a maximum of 15 school days to effect an improvement. If there are further absences within the 15 day monitoring period then a Penalty Notice may be issued
- An excluded pupil present in a public place without justification, during the school hours of the school day where the pupil is on roll, during the first five days of each fixed period or permanent exclusion.

The appropriate paperwork will be completed to send to the Local Authority for processing. This may result in a £60 fine per child if paid within 21 days. Payment after this but within 28 days is £120. Payment does not come to school.

## End of School Day Arrangements

We would like to reiterate the importance of giving your child 'going home instructions' before they come into school and inform teachers/school office of any variations to the normal collection arrangements at the <u>START</u> of the day.

We appreciate that on occasions you will need to contact school during the school day to amend these arrangements and we are more than happy to pass these on, unfortunately these requests are becoming more frequent and this is causing classes to have unnecessary disruptions during learning time.

In order for us to communicate any changes with staff and pupils we need you to contact school as early as possible in order that the message can be passed on in time for us to safeguard your child before they are dismissed at 3.15pm.

## Webster Stratton

Any parents or carers who are interested in attending Webster Stratton: this is a positive parenting group, to support parents and carers with positive strategies to improve their child's behaviour. The sessions are held on Tuesday mornings between 9.30am-11.30am, and they will begin in January. For further information please contact Mrs Hitchens.

#### After School Clubs

Our after school clubs are always very popular with our pupils, so we have limited places to offer and we politely request that if your child is given a place in a club, that they attend regularly. If your child cannot attend for any reason a parent or carer MUST contact school and inform us of a reason why, we cannot accept notification from pupils. Failure to inform school could lead to safeguarding issues and we will not let the children leave school unless collected by an adult.

#### School Meals

Pupils from Reception to Year 2 will continue to receive 'universal free school meals'. Pupils from Years 3-6 who are not entitled to 'free school meals' are required to pay in advance for any meals ordered from school through the 'School Gateway'. These are priced at £2.01 per day.

#### **World Sepsis Day**


