### Basic Skills Quality Mark assessment: WELL DONE PARK STREET!

Our school recently enjoyed a very positive review from a Basic Skills Assessor to make a judgement on whether we are meeting the needs of the children in terms of Literacy and Numeracy. The Assessor was incredibly positive about his visit to school. He commented on:

- The very warm, friendly and welcoming ethos of staff and children.
- The passionate leaders who care a lot about the school and the progress that the children make.
- The school's consistent and positive approach to teaching phonics in the Early Years and KS1 which is enabling pupils to segment and blend in order to read words more independently.
- The consistent approach to reinforcing english and mathematics displays around the school providing continuity in pupils' learning from one year to the next.
- The consistent and positive development of pupils' handwriting skills across the school, resulting in pupils being able to write independently and neatly.
- Pupils' positive attitudes to learning in reading, and their enjoyment for (and love of) books.
- The range of resources available for pupils, helping to reinforce key learning, particularly in mathematics.

### **Our targets for the future are:**

1. To fully embed 'Read, Write, Inc.' in order to further develop pupils' ability to read and write in the Early Years and at Key Stage 1.
2. To continue to develop pupils' ability to apply spellings taught in their independent writing.
3. To further develop problem-solving and reasoning skills in mathematics, particularly in pupils' written work.

### **Governor Development Weeks:**

Thank you to our Governors who continue to give up their time to visit school. This term they have worked with leaders regarding improvements to school, in an array of subjects — their contribution is massively appreciated.

### **National tests for Years 1, 2, 4 and 6 2019-20—IMPORTANT DATES TO NOTE!**

Already staff and children are working hard on ensuring they are preparing for their end of year statutory tests in Years 1, 2, 4 and 6. I would like to explain what each of these tests are and when they will be taking place.

**Firstly**, many of you will be aware that Year 2 and Year 6 children nationally have to sit their 'Statutory Assessment Tests', commonly known as SATs in May each year—this applies to our current Year 1 and Year 6 children in Teams AC, CT and LL.

The dates for these assessment are set by the Government and therefore have to be rigidly adhered to. We ask that if your child is in these two year groups then you **MUST** ensure 100% attendance during these testing times:

**Year 2 children:** will be sitting their SATs throughout the month of May.

**Year 6 children:** will be sitting their SATs throughout the week commencing **Monday 11th May 2020** (Monday—Thursday inclusive).

**Secondly**, our Year 1 children also have to sit their 'Phonics Screening Check' (PSC) at the end of Year 1. This will take place during the week commencing **Monday 8th June 2020**. The dates for this assessment are set by the Government also and therefore have to be rigidly adhered to. We ask that if your child is in Year 1 then you **MUST** ensure 100% attendance during these testing times:

This also applies to children who are currently in Year 2, who did not pass their Phonics Screening Check when they were in Year 1, as they will need to resit the test.

**Thirdly**, our Year 4 children will now be required to take their 'Multiplication Tables Check', a new initiative introduced by the Government. This will take place during a three week window from Monday 8th June 2020. The dates for these assessment are set by the Government and therefore have to be rigidly adhered to. We ask that if your child is in Year 4 then you **MUST** ensure 100% attendance during these three weeks of testing times.

Should you have already booked any holidays / absences from school during these times then please begin to liaise with school regarding the dates your child will be away from school, so as teachers may be able to plan for this and ensure their tests are administered at convenient times to school and yourselves, within the testing windows. This would be an absolute last resort; it is important that your child's testing periods are as calm as possible for them so as they can do the best for themselves and our school.

## School Fundraising

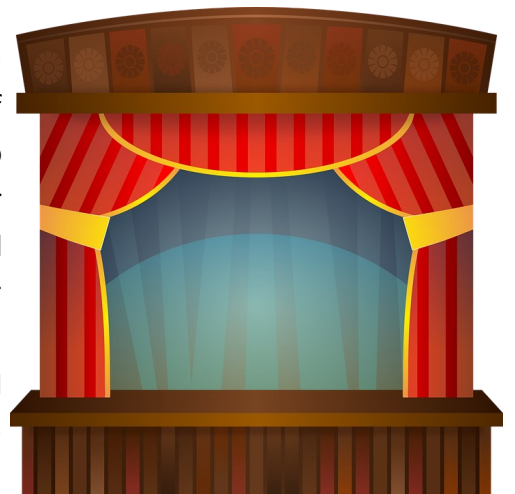
Well what a busy half term of fund raising we have had!

## Christmas Lunch & Jumper Day

During December we held our annual Christmas Jumper day and enjoyed our yummy Christmas dinner. Children and staff enjoyed the festivities and would like to thank the Catering team from ISS led by Mrs Mumford and all of our dinnertime staff that supported on the day.

Any parents or carers who are interested in attending Webster Stratton: this is a positive parenting group, to support parents and carers with positive strategies to improve their child's behaviour. The sessions are held on Tuesday mornings between 9.30am-11.30am, and they will begin in January. For further information please contact Mrs Hitchens.

### New Leave of Absence Policy

Leave of absence for holidays taken during term time are unauthorised by school unless there are 'exceptional circumstances'. (Each case is processed on an individual case by case basis). Parents need to complete a leave of absence form at least two weeks in advance of the holiday and applications are then processed and may result in a Penalty Notice being issued by the Local Authority.

Parents are informed of a revised Code of Conduct for the issuing of Penalty Notices resulting from a leave of absence. The following criteria are **no longer** taken into account:

- previous or current percentage attendance
- previous periods of leave of absence
- leave of absences taken in the first term
- exams and assessments
- Employer's letter(s)
- school attendance target

Where possible, holidays should be taken during school holiday periods and not term time to avoid missed education. Following an unauthorised holiday, parents will also receive a letter from school informing of the impact of the holiday on the child's percentage attendance.

Under the new Code, Penalty Notices can be issued if **any** of the following three conditions applies:

- A pupil has accrued five or more consecutive days of unauthorised leave of absence (holiday in term time)
- If issued due to sporadic unauthorised absences, then, other than in specific circumstances, the liable parent/carer will receive a formal warning of the possibility of a Penalty Notice being issued and be given a maximum of 15 school days to effect an improvement. If there are further absences within the 15 day monitoring period then a Penalty Notice may be issued
- An excluded pupil present in a public place without justification, during the school hours of the school day where the pupil is on roll, during the first five days of each fixed period or permanent exclusion.

The appropriate paperwork will be completed to send to the Local Authority for processing. This may result in a £60 fine per child if paid within 21 days. Payment after this but within 28 days is £120. Payment does not come to school.

### End of School Day Arrangements

We would like to reiterate the importance of giving your child 'going home instructions' before they come into school and inform teachers/school office of any variations to the normal collection arrangements at the **START** of the day.

We appreciate that on occasions you will need to contact school during the school day to amend these arrangements and we are more than happy to pass these on, unfortunately these requests are becoming more frequent and this is causing classes to have unnecessary disruptions during learning time.

In order for us to communicate any changes with staff and pupils we need you to contact school as early as possible in order that the message can be passed on in time for us to safeguard your child before they are dismissed at 3.15pm.

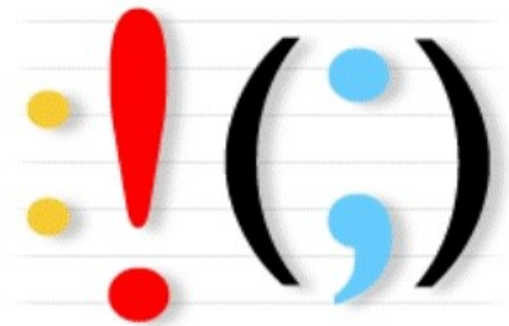

For safeguarding reasons, the school's main gates at the bottom of the drive are locked at **8.20am and re-open again at 8.50am**. They are also locked from **2.30pm until 3.30pm**. Only authorised users with the code are permitted to pass through these gates and travel up the drive during these times. We ask that the code be kept confidential and not be disclosed to anyone including members of family or children. This is very important for us to keep our pupils safe! If anyone is aware of unauthorised use please inform the office.
