I hope you have all had a wonderful Christmas time and a happy new year too. I hope you have all enjoyed a bit of a rest and relaxation time with your children, family and friends – we were all very ready for it at Park Street!

What a busy half term it has been in autumn 2, with some amazing events for the children and opportunities for parents to get back involved in school life. I hope you enjoy reading about them below!

COVID-19

Thank you for your continued support of the school in recent months. The autumn term generally has been very settled, with only a small number of children testing positive for COVID-19. Instead, we have seen lots of sickness bugs, cold viruses, Tonsillitis and a few Scarlett Fever cases resurfacing.

Whilst the guidance is now incredibly limited regarding COVID-19, we appreciate **parents and families that continue to remain vigilant** and **follow the Government guidance which Park Street continues to adopt**. This means if your child tests positive for COVID-19 then we ask that they self-isolate for three days or until they are well enough to come to school. THANK YOU.

Should you have any queries or doubts in your mind then please phone school and discuss your situation with the Admin team. They will refer in to the Senior Leadership Team for advice and support.

Should you yourself as parent have to self-isolate, there is always the option to drop off / pick up later at the top of the drive, to limit your contact with others, if this helps,

Attendance Policy

As you will be aware, we continue to be proactive and adopt a policy which promotes excellent attendance and punctuality. Park Street continues to work as part of a wider Trust team to continue its excellent progress in improving attendance, so all children can thrive and achieve their best.

Obviously if your child develops COVID-19 and has to self-isolate for the 3 days, there is nothing that can be done about it and the priority is that the child (and your family) are keeping as safe and well as possible.

We also know, from time to time, your child may become unwell with other things too. Whatever your child's illness we ask that you let school know at your earliest convenience and **keep us informed each day of their absence**. Should you wish to discuss any illnesses then the school's Admin team or our Parent Support Advisor, Mrs Hitchens, will be able to help and advise. Our school works hard to ensure three-day absence visits are completed by our SLT / PSA for safeguarding reasons and to support families.

Your child should always be at school for 8.40am and should report to the main school entrance if they arrive later than 8.45am, when the playground gates close. We do still have a very small handful of families who continue to drop their children off a little later than expected, however, these are picked up on immediately and school are already working hard with such families through initial reminder letters, contact with the Attendance Team / EWO and further Individual School Attendance Panel Meetings (ISAPs). Lateness has a clear detrimental impact on the children as they miss learning when they are at their most alert!

Our Attendance Lead, Mrs Green, continues to work with Mrs Julie Marsh, our Education Welfare Officer. They liaise on a two-weekly basis regarding families which are causing concern and provide early intervention. This may involve a phone call from either of them to discuss a fall or concern in attendance / punctuality, a letter or a home visit if there is further discussion needed. If matters do not improve, then families will be asked to meet with the Attendance Team and SLT in school, sometimes alongside Mrs Chavan (School Governor responsible for Attendance). We hope this reassures families and shows the school's tenacious approach. If matters improve, we of course thank and congratulate families and children too!

Thank you to the families who always make sure their child attends school and arrives at school on time.

We are seeing a massive increase in holidays taken again in term time. Can I take this opportunity to remind you that these will <u>not</u> be authorised unless there are extra special reasons – holidays being postponed and re-arranged in term time due to COVID-19 will <u>not</u> be authorised. Schooling has been disrupted far too much and we are having a real surge on teaching and learning to help the children 'catch up' – please support us in this. We will provide any families who go on unauthorised holidays with a follow up letter to demonstrate the impact of the holiday on their child's education. We understand desperately the impact that the last few years has had on everyone's mental health and wellbeing, but our policy remains tight and robust and it is the law that children attend school regularly.

Please can I also remind parents that:

- if your child is attending a funeral, then a 'Leave of Absence' form still needs to be completed
- if you need to fill a 'Leave of Absence' form in, then please put as much information as possible so as the best decision can be made by the Attendance Team.

As you know, each week we continue to celebrate winning Teams for their collective attendance – the class successes have been as follows this half term. The top two classes each week earn £5 which they collect over the year. In the last term they count their money up and organise a team celebration. This could be anything from a McDonald's treat for the class, the ice cream van visiting school or books for the children in class, for example. Team work makes the dream work!

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We have enjoyed much more positive attendance figures this term, which is fantastic! We still all need to keep working as a TEAM though to improve this. I know a lot of children have had lots of horrible coughs and colds this half term and there has been signs of Hand, Foot and Mouth, as well as Scarlett Fever making a bit of a resurgence. These can be nasty illnesses. We will always monitor such outbreaks and act accordingly in line with Public Health advice etc. Hopefully the Christmas break will have helped in stopping further potential spreads of autumn/winter illnesses.

As many of you will know, we have recently sent out the Trust's attendance letters to any families whose attendance is causing a little concern. This is purely for your attention at this stage. Hopefully we will be able to work together to improve this in the new year. We do have an obligation to let any families know where attendance needs to show signs of improvement, so as it is does not have a negative impact on children in school.

We are also working really hard, to improve the punctuality of certain families and are monitoring this closely, reporting in to our Trust central team who are also monitoring this. We are very passionate about learning starting straight away, as soon as children walk through the door, so even if they are a few minutes late, they will miss out. Plus, being on time is a life skill...we don't often get away with it in the work place, so it is important we teach the children this skill early in life, to prepare them fully for their future.

Uniform Policy

If any families are in need of support with school uniform then please simply mention this to Mrs C Hitchens (PSA). She has been working hard with some of our school Governors and Parental Group this half term and has created a stock of uniform down at The Salvation Army site, which parents in need can access.

Please note the following important points:

- Leggings are not part of the school uniform so please ensure these are avoided.
- Children also should not wear makeup for school, or false nails.
- Children should not be coming to school wearing items of jewellery eg bracelets / necklaces.
- **PE**: your child's team has set PE days when they complete their PE lessons. However, some weeks due to staff absence, school trips, school events etc, these lessons may be moved around. So, we always suggest that your child brings their PE kit to school on a Monday morning, leaves it in school for the duration of the week on their coat peg and then takes it home on a Friday afternoon to be washed over the weekend (and back again for Monday morning)!

Lost property

Items of clothing are sometimes misplaced by children especially outdoor coats. Could you please ensure items are clearly marked/labelled up with your child's name - this will make it easier to locate any missing items and re-unite them with their owner.

On warmer days, children often take their coats off outside at lunch time and leave them in the designated areas. Our Playground Leaders run around towards the end of the lunch time to collect these and return any back to their rightful owner (if they are clearly labelled). The remaining jackets get put in the lost property boxes as we do not condone older children walking around classes in learning time to relocate property. This is also a conscious effort to encourage children to be more independent. Please do always encourage your child to place their coat safely and collect at the end of the play time, as staff in school do.

Reading expectations at Park Street

As you know, at Park Street we love reading and value the importance of this on a child's academic attainment, progress and love of school life. After all, if you can read, you can do anything!



Please note that if your child attends Park Street, we have the following high expectations:

- Your child should take their reading book and reading record home each evening and read for up to 10 minutes. This can be done independently, if your child is able to.
- An adult from home should initial / sign each day, to let staff know that their child has read.
- Books and records should be returned each morning for staff to track and check and celebrate daily readers on classroom displays.
- Teachers will let parents know if books have not been returned, through consistent notes home.

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Your support in this is massively appreciated! We must always keep encouraging our children to read. It opens doors to all areas of learning and adds such fun to their lives. If your child is a reluctant reader, then please do speak to your child's class teacher about ideas which they use to engage children in class.

Governors attend Park Street for Governor Development sessions

Our school Governors have once again been in to school to visit this last term, meeting with the subject leader teachers in school. They have supported Leaders brilliantly in the next steps for each subject area and have enjoyed visiting classes, talking to children and staff alike.

Reading Together continues each Tuesday!

Many thanks to Miss McGinnes, our Reading Leader in school, who has continued to organise for the EYFS and Year 1 'Reading Together' sessions to continue this autumn term. Miss McGinnes and myself have been blown away by your support; it was amazing to see so many parents turn up each Tuesday, to read with their child. Don't forget, any parent who attends naturally enters a competition for their child to win a book, each week!

This is an excellent opportunity for parents and children and is open to parents of children in Nursery, Reception and Year 1 at the moment – Teams CM (AM and PM); CW, EO and CH. Session times are:

Every Tuesday afternoon from 2.45pm until 3.15pm

NB: for morning Nursery children, this will be at 10.45am until 11.15am

No booking, just turn up and enjoy! We ask for only one adult per child to attend. The event is held in the school's main Hall, which you can access though the main Reception area.

For those parents who continually attend – thank you! It is making a huge impact on your child's reading progress!

Responsible Jobs for children through school help empower the children and provide them with opportunities to develop their co-operation and leadership skills...

All of our 'responsible jobs' through school have been established once again this term and the children are doing a fantastic job in taking their roles very seriously. Such responsible jobs certainly help the staff team out tremendously, but they also give the children a sense of pride, purpose and ownership too. Park Streeters LOVE doing jobs as they love the satisfaction that helping others brings. The 'responsible jobs' through school are as follows, just in case your child(ren) ever mention what we get up to when you are not there!

Playground Leaders: such children help the SMSAs at lunch time on the Reception - Year 3 playground. They wear special tabards so as children and staff can easily see them and they set up the games equipment at lunch time, for the others to use. They then play with the younger children, engaging them in physical and competitive sports and games, as well as colouring and reading with them in the other areas. They support the SMSA team also, looking after any younger children who may have had an accident, for example.

School Council: such children meet every two weeks with Miss Baxter, to help organise special, upcoming events and to discuss aspects of the school, which the children would like to support in improving. Our School Council provides a lot of pupil voice to help us as Leaders, make the school as great as it possibly can be! They have had lots of success already this term, by speaking to ISS Catering about lunch options and also planning Children In Need Day!

Junior Reader Leaders: our Readers are led by Miss Baxter and again this group meet every other week to discuss reading and how our school can encourage more reading and a love of reading, through school. They aim to raise the profile of the importance of reading by running competitions and thinking of exciting opportunities which the remaining children would enjoy! They also work hard on a rota basis through school, at 1pm each day, where they visit other classes and listen to other children read, who might find it a challenge or who might not have quality reading opportunities outside of school. They are a credit to Miss Baxter and our school!

Arts Council: our Art Council are led by Mrs Longden and they meet every other week, to plan exciting art opportunities for the children through school. They have launched both art and poetry competitions so far this year and have an action-packed calendar for moving forwards too!

Eco-Warriors: these are children especially chosen for their skills and willingness to look after the environment and our local community. They work alongside Miss Clementson and think of ways to keep costs down for school, research the ways in which we can best recycle in school and also partake in events eg litter picking and bird box building, to help look after our local community for its residents.

Digital Leaders: our Digital Leaders in school look after the Computer Suite, laptops and i-Pads and offer digital support and advice to children and teachers through school. They help keep the Computer Suite in good condition and promote online safety. They work alongside Mr Fidment and Mr Davison as Computing Leads.

Prefects and Head Boy / Girl: our Prefects are those Year 6s considered to be practically perfect in every way! They show excellent behaviour and model expectations to the younger children in school. They help support our Leadership team in events and also show prospective children and parents around school. They are real ambassadors for our school! Each year a Head Boy / Girl is also elected and this honour is given for continued hard work, effort, enthusiasm and impeccable high standards throughout all of their journey at Park Street.

All 'responsible job' holders will be presented with their cap / tabard or badge to wear with pride in and around school soon!

Famous People Assembly Studies and DR TIM...

Focusing on such significant people has allowed us to explore some big themes, including:

Working hard to achieve success; helping and supporting others; discovering our talents and using these to help others, as well as diversity and uniqueness.

We have also launched DR TIM through school, to help the children understand the important British Values, which we aim to teach the children about in all areas of learning. These are:

D - Democracy

R - Rule of law

T - Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs

I - Individual Liberty

M - Mutual Respect

Please do talk to your children about these core values too and how every day life should be lived according to such principles. This will really help reinforce what we teach the children at school. If you hear the children mention DR TIM – you know who he is and why he is important!

Workshops for Parents

This half term, we have really enjoyed welcoming more parents back in to school on a face to face basis, to help teach them about how we teach aspects of learning. It has been lovely to see so many parents involved in aspects such as Reading Together, Reading workshops for parents; Read, Write, Inc workshops for Parents, KS2 SATS workshops for Parents.

We have a number going ahead following the Christmas break too, in to the spring term. We are holding Creative Writing Workshops for parents, Reading Workshops for Parents of KS2 children, Webster Stratton (positive parenting group) with Mrs Hitchens and Mr Fidment is also hoping to hold some SEND and behaviour coffee meet ups for parents.

All of these are aimed at supporting you, so as you can better support your children with their learning at home. Should you have any ideas or suggestions of other support workshops which we could run, please do discuss these with a member of the Leadership team and we shall factor these in to the calendar for you.

Trips and Visitors - important information for parents to note

Our staff are busy trying to ensure that each term, our Teams have an enrichment through a special event, visitors to school or visits outside of school. Naturally, a lot of these come at an extra cost to school, which we ask for a voluntary contribution from parents towards.

School staff work hard to try and get the best experiences for the most reduced price through getting quotes from different coaches and companies, as well as varied places which could offer experiences. Signs of the times are that these costs are on the rise, as are most things in everyday life. School can only ever ask for a 'voluntary contribution' by law, but please note that unless we have significant contribution to the take up of trips, the school budget simply cannot cater for trips to go, so alternative experiences would have to replace these eg by an enrichment day in school, which obviously is far less effective than an actual trip out, for example. School cannot, not allow children to go on school trips, despite non-payment, but if there is significant non-payment, then school will be left with no other option than to cancel.

Please can parents be aware of this so as they are not disappointed. Our recent trip to Murton Park nearly had to be cancelled due to hundreds of pounds in non-contribution. Fortunately, we managed to successfully ensure the trip went ahead and no children or staff were left disappointed – thank you.

Whilst we totally understand that everyone is challenged by the rising costs of everything at the moment, we want to respond equally to parental questionnaire wishes where parents identify that they would like school trips to once again commence. We thank families for all of their hard work and willingness to work with school on this matter. Schools and families alike will all be faced with the financial hardships to come. Please do know though that school will always do everything they can to reduce costs.

Year 6 Visit Netherwood for transition afternoon - 03.11.22

Our Year 6 Teams were invited to Netherwood to begin their 'secondary transition' at the beginning of November. This was for all Year 6 children to go on, whether they intend on transitioning to Netherwood or elsewhere. The trip gave them an insight in to life in a secondary school.

Please, once again, note the following dates for the statutory assessment dates for 2022-23. Hopefully this will help families ensure their children are in school for these very important times. I am sure you will agree that the children are encouraged to work hard during the course of the year and it would be a shame for them not to experience success in such opportunities. Such assessments prepare the children well for later in life and also help the school in progressing and moving forward to greater success.

The dates for 2022-23 are as follows:

- ➤ If your child will be in Year 1 during 2022-23, their Phonics Screen Check will be during the week commencing Monday 12th June 2023.
- > If your child will be in Year 2 during 2022-23, their Key Stage 1 tests will be during the month of May 2023.
- If your child will be in Year 4 during 2022-23, their Multiplication tables check will be during the two-week window, week commencing Monday 5th June 2023.
- If your child will be in Year 6 during 2022-23, their Key Stage 2 tests will be during the week commencing Monday 8th May 2023 and will be organised in line with national requirements:

Tuesday 9th May – English Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar Papers 1 and 2

Wednesday 10th May – English Reading Paper

Thursday 11th May – Mathematics Paper 1 and 2

Friday 12th May – Mathematics Paper 3

NB these dates have been amended due to the Government's decision to place a bank holiday for the King's coronation on Monday 8th May 2023.
