Newsletter – Spring 2

I hope you all had a restful Easter holiday and you managed a little family time with the children being off school.

I am writing to keep you up to speed on some recent news from school over this past half term and to remind parents of key information.

COVID-19

Thank you for your continued support of the school in recent months. The second half of the spring term has continued to present its challenges, with a number of staff absences due to COVID-19.

I would please ask that **parents and families continue to remain vigilant** and **follow the Government** guidance which Park Street adopts.

Much of the school routines are now completely back to normal, but of course we would act in line with any Local Authority or Public Health guidance as and when given and communicate this to parents. As the saying goes, we are 'learning to live with it all now'.

Should you have any queries or doubts in your mind then please do phone school and discuss your situation with the Admin team. They will refer in to the Senior Leadership Team for advice and support.

Attendance Policy

Despite COVID-19 and the impact this is having on children's attendance, we still adopt a policy promoting excellent attendance and punctuality. The school is working as part of a wider Trust team now to ensure excellent attendance is achieved by all children. Obviously if your child develops COVID-19 and has to self-isolate for the 5 days, there is nothing that can be done about it and the priority is that the child (and your family) are keeping as safe and well as possible. We also know, from time to time, your child may become unwell with other things too. Whatever your child's illness we ask that you let school know at your earliest convenience and keep us informed each day of their absence. Should you wish to discuss any illnesses then the school's Admin team or our Parent Support Advisor, Mrs Hitchens, will be able to help and advise.

The original school start times are working well: your child should be at school for 8.40am and should report to the main school entrance if they arrive later than 8.45am. We do still have a handful of families who continue to drop their children off a little later than expected. This has a clear detrimental impact on the children as they miss learning when they are at their most alert! Such families are being managed by our Attendance Team and will be referred to the Educational Welfare Team if situations do not improve. Thank you to the families who always make sure their child arrives at school on time.

We are again seeing an increase in holidays taken again in term time. Can I take this opportunity to remind you that these will <u>not</u> be authorised unless there are extra special reasons – holidays being postponed and re-arranged in term time due to COVID-19 will <u>not</u> be authorised. Schooling has been disrupted far too much and we are having a real surge on teaching and learning to help the children 'catch up' – please support us in this.



Uniform Policy

If any families are in need of support with school uniform then please simply mention this to a member of staff who will bring it to the attention of Mrs Hitchens (PSA). She has a stock of almost brand-new uniform ready to hand to anyone in need. Similarly, if you have any good quality spare uniform, we can always use this and if you place it in a plastic bag and pass it to a member of staff in your child's class team, they will pass it on to Mrs Hitchens (PSA). Leggings are not part of the school uniform so please can these be avoided.

Ventilation will remain key at the moment and is something which is practised in every classroom as a crucial way to help limit any COVID-19 spread. However, with the weather now much milder, your child does not need to bring an additional non-uniform jumper/jacket in to school. Their normal school uniform will suffice.

Children should not be coming to school wearing items of jewellery eg bracelets / necklaces. This is for health and safety reasons but also, we do not want the children to be upset should they misplace or lose valuable or important items. Please also avoid having children's ears pierced during the academic year. Children are not allowed to do PE with them in (a compulsory part of the National Curriculum) and our staff team are not allowed to take these out for children either. Please try to stick to the summer holidays to have your child's ears pierced as this will leave 6 weeks for them to have them done and potentially learn how to take them out themselves. If your child has their ears pierced but finds it tricky to take them out independently for PE lessons, then it may be advisable to check your child's normal PE days and take their earrings out on the morning. On occasions, PE lessons move around during the week, depending on staffing, but this would help massively. Also, if your child is wearing earrings, it is not advisable that they wear expensive earrings as in a busy school, they can be easily misplaced, through no fault of anyone's. Your support would be appreciated!

PE: as mentioned, your child's team has set PE days when they complete their PE lessons. However, some weeks due to staff absence, school trips, school events etc, these lessons may be moved around. So, we always suggest that your child brings their PE kit to school on a Monday morning, leaves it in school for the duration of the week on their coat peg and then takes it home on a Friday afternoon to be washed over the weekend (and back again for Monday morning)!

Lost property

Items of clothing are sometimes misplaced by children especially outdoor coats. Could you please ensure items are clearly marked/labelled up with your child's name - this will make it easier to locate any missing items and re-unite them with their owner.

In the warmer weather, children often take their coats off outside at lunch time and leave them on the field. Our Playground Leaders run around towards the end of the lunch time to collect these and return any back to their rightful owner (if they are clearly labelled). The remaining jackets get put in the lost property boxes.

Lost property is placed in the baskets in the entrance of school, should you need to try to locate a piece of uniform.

Books back to school

Prior to COVID-19, school spent an awful lot of money on resourcing the school library, so there were quality and varied books at age appropriate levels for the children to read. As lockdowns began, children were sent home with books to keep reading, but unfortunately, we still find ourselves in the situation where a lot of these books have not been returned to school and as such, our library is looking a little depleted, which is such a shame. We are now faced with having to spend another £2000+ in resourcing it.

PLEASE COULD ALL CHILDREN AND PARENTS HAVE ONE FINAL CHECK OF YOUR HOMES AND BOOK SHELVES AND RETURN ANY BOOKS TO SCHOOL – THEY WILL BE STAMPED AT THE FRONT WITH THE SCHOOL'S NAME. **MANY THANKS FOR YOUR SUPPORT AND EFFORTS IN THIS!**

Special Jobs Around School

Park Street's 'special jobs' have once again started this March in school, following a period of time where the school had to ensure the safety of children and staff and not allow the children to mix fully, due to COVID-19. We are now thrilled that we have the confidence to reintroduce these, for the children to continue to have that sense of responsibility and ownership. These really do encourage the children to be active citizens! Such jobs include:

Playground Leaders - these children buddy up with SMSAs and support younger children in school by encouraging them to play positively with the equipment.

Eco-Reps - these children look after the school environment and will be doing regular litter picks in the locality!

School Council Reps - these will meet Miss Baxter and Mrs Firth on a regular basis and are the pupil voice for the school. They already have lots of fantastic ideas to further improve our lovely school!

Art Council Reps - these meet with Mrs Longden and Mrs Fitchett to look at ways in which our curriculum can be further enriched by Art and performance opportunities.



Digital Leaders - these work with Mrs Firth and Mr Fidment to ensure that the Computing equipment is well looked after and organise the i-pads for use through school.
