#### Newsletter – Summer 1

I hope you all had a restful spring bank holiday and you managed a little family time with the children being off school. I hope you enjoyed the Jubilee celebrations too!

I am writing to keep you up to speed on some recent news from school over this past half term and to remind parents of key information.

#### COVID-19

Thank you for your continued support of the school in recent months. The summer term seems to have appeared more settled with fewer children testing positive, albeit staffing has remained a challenge with some testing positive.

Whilst the guidance is now very limited, we appreciate parents and families that continue to remain vigilant and follow the Government guidance which Park Street adopts. THANK YOU.

All of the school routines are now back to normal, but of course we would act in line with any Local Authority or Public Health guidance as and when given and communicate this to parents.

Should you have any queries or doubts in your mind then please do phone school and discuss your situation with the Admin team. They will refer in to the Senior Leadership Team for advice and support.

Should you yourself as a parent have to self-isolate, there is always still the option to drop off / pick up later at the top of the drive, to limit your contact with others, if this helps.

#### **Attendance Policy**

Despite COVID-19 and the impact this is having on children's attendance, we continue to be proactive and adopt a policy which promotes excellent attendance and punctuality – something prior to COVID we were really proud of and had really made a difference to the school's attendance figures! Park Street continues to work as part of a wider Trust team now to continue this excellent progress in attendance, so all children can thrive and achieve their best. It was pleasing to read in the recent parental questionnaires that 99% of parents agree that school places a high emphasis on attendance and punctuality, with 77% of these strongly agreeing too! It is pleasing to see parents notice the strong ethos which staff work hard to create around positive attendance.

Obviously if your child develops COVID-19 and has to self-isolate for the 3-5 days, there is nothing that can be done about it and the priority is that the child (and your family) are keeping as safe and well as possible. We also know, from time to time, your child may become unwell with other things too. Chicken-pox and sickness bugs have been pretty prevalent this winter and spring! Whatever your child's illness we ask that you let school know at your earliest convenience and keep us informed each day of their absence. Should you wish to discuss any illnesses then the school's Admin team or our Parent Support Advisor, Mrs Hitchens, will be able to help and advise.

Your child should always be at school for 8.40am and should report to the main school entrance if they arrive later than 8.45am. We do still have a very small handful of families who continue to drop their children off a little later than expected. This has a clear detrimental impact on the children as they miss learning when they are at their most alert! Such families are being managed by our Attendance Team who work with the Educational Welfare Team, so please be reassured that school are working hard to improve matters for such children.

Our Attendance Lead, Mrs Green, continues to work with Clyde Buckle, our Education Welfare Officer. They liaise on a two-weekly basis regarding families which are causing concern and provide early intervention. This may involve a phone call from either of them to discuss a decline or concern in attendance / punctuality, a letter or a home visit if there is further discussion needed. If matters do not improve, then families will be asked to meet with the Attendance Team and SLT in school. We hope this reassures families and shows the school's tenacious approach. If matters improve, we of course thank and congratulate families and children too!

# Thank you to the families who always make sure their child attends school and arrives at school on time.

We are seeing an increase in holidays taken again in term time. Can I take this opportunity to remind you that these will **not** be authorised unless there are extra special reasons – holidays being postponed and rearranged in term time due to COVID-19 will **not** be authorised. Schooling has been disrupted far too much and we are having a real surge on teaching and learning to help the children 'catch up' – please support us in this. We will provide any families who go on unauthorised holidays with a follow up letter to demonstrate the impact of the holiday on their child's education. We understand desperately the impact that the last few years has had on everyone's mental health and wellbeing, but our policy remains tight and robust.

Each week we celebrate winning Teams for their collective attendance – the class successes have been as follows this half term. The top two classes each week earn £5 which they collect over the year. In the last term they count their money up and organise a team celebration. This could be anything from a McDonald's treat for the class, the ice cream van visiting school or books for the children in class, for example. Team work makes the dream work!

The Team with the <u>most</u> success and best attendance in summer 1 was Team LF and therefore they were invited to come to school in non-uniform on **Monday 6**<sup>th</sup> **June 2022** as a class reward! Keep it up children!

### **Uniform Policy**

If any families are in need of support with school uniform then please simply mention this to a member of staff who will bring it to the attention of Mrs Hitchens (PSA). She has a stock of almost brand-new uniform ready to hand to anyone in need. If you have any spare shoes, which you think another family could use, then please pass these on to Mrs Hitchens. At this point, this is the only item of uniform donation which can be accepted due to the high volume of previous uniforms passed in.



Please note the following important points:

- Leggings are not part of the school uniform so please can these be avoided. This can be a contentious point as lots of children would prefer to come to school in leggings and when other children see this happening, it can cause further problems for those parents who abide by the rules.
- Children also should not wear makeup for school, or false nails. This is not encouraged as a school as it can lead to health and safety issues, as well as cause upset amongst the children too.
- Children should not be coming to school wearing items of jewellery eg bracelets / necklaces. Please also avoid having children's ears pierced during the academic year. Children are not allowed to do PE with them in (a compulsory part of the National Curriculum) and our staff team are not allowed to take these out for children either. Please try to stick to the summer holidays to have your child's ears pierced as this will leave 6 weeks for them to have them done and potentially learn how to take them out themselves. If your child has their ears pierced but finds it tricky to take them out independently for PE lessons, then it may be advisable to check your child's normal PE days and take their earrings out on the morning.
- **PE:** your child's team has set PE days when they complete their PE lessons. However, some weeks due to staff absence, school trips, school events etc, these lessons may be moved around. So, we always suggest that your child brings their PE kit to school on a Monday morning, leaves it in school for the duration of the week on their coat peg and then takes it home on a Friday afternoon to be washed over the weekend (and back again for Monday morning)!
- If you would like to send your child to school in a summer dress, then this should be the blue or burgundy checked dresses, in line with policy. No other colours are accepted as part of the school's Uniform Policy. *George* at Asda and *Tu* at Sainsbury's are two places which sell both colours.

#### Lost property

Items of clothing are sometimes misplaced by children especially outdoor coats. Could you please ensure items are clearly marked/labelled up with your child's name - this will make it easier to locate any missing items and re-unite them with their owner.

In the warmer weather, children often take their coats off outside at lunch time and leave them on the field. Our Playground Leaders run around towards the end of the lunch time to collect these and return any back to their rightful owner (if they are clearly labelled). The remaining jackets get put in the lost property boxes.

Lost property is placed in the baskets in the entrance of school, should you need to try to locate a piece of uniform. There are lots of items there at the moment and we will endeavour to ensure all this is matched to the right owners within this summer 2 term.

## **Summer months!**

Now that the summer months are upon us, I would just like to remind parents that it is good practise, on sunny days, to make sure your child has some sun screen put on them before they come to school in the morning. This should help protect their skin in the morning and through lunch times, when the sun is at its strongest. Adults in school are not allowed to administer sun screen for the children. If you want your child to top up their sun screen throughout the course of the day, then your child needs to be able to put this on themselves, without adult intervention. It is rare that this top up is ever needed as lots of sun screens for children nowadays last at least the duration of a school day.

Please could I also remind you of the importance of your child bringing a water bottle to school each day. The bottles help keep children well hydrated during the day and this assists with their learning too! Children can re-fill their bottles when in school. Any bottles should be transparent and labelled with your child's full name. On warm days, the water bottles are taken outside at lunch time so writing the child's team on would be a good idea too.




#### Books back to school

These MUST be brought back on a daily basis and if they have not been seen by a member of staff, then notes home and phone calls will be made. This is purely so we are actively encouraging the children to take responsibility for the books they love and to ensure none go missing again!




She spoke about how significant this opportunity was for them and complemented their work as vital to supporting the people of Barnsley – we were so proud of the children's achievements and what an honour!

## **Exciting staffing information**

Following a re-structure of the Senior Leadership Team in school, I am pleased to inform you that Miss C McGinnes and Mr A Fidment are now the school's Assistant Headteachers. For the foreseeable, Miss McGinnes will remain the Nursery teacher and Mr Fidment will remain one of the Year 6 teachers also.

Miss McGinnes will be the school's official 'Reading Leader' and will continue to lead Early Years in to Key Stage 1. Mr Fidment will continue as SENDCo but will also take on more of a lead with Inclusion on a whole, including behaviour, the care for Looked After Children, transition and will also take a lead in the safeguarding of such children.

I am also pleased to announce that Miss E Overton will become a permanent member of staff at Park Street in September. Miss C Clementson will also remain in a part time role, teaching alongside Mrs J Watson.

Full staffing arrangements for 2022-23 will be sent out in due course as well as information around transition and classes for 2022-23, including support staff arrangements.
