

Autumn	Recognise vowels and consonants	
	Write words containing common suffixes ing, es, ed	
	Spell and distinguish between sea/see, won/one, son/sun, bee/be, blew/blue,	
	night/knight, hear and here	
	Write sentences that are mostly correctly demarcated with capital letters, full stops,	
	question marks and exclamation marks (using hold a sentence)	
	Write simple and compound sentences.	
	Write coordinating sentences using conjunctions - or, and, but	
	Write a rour phrase that can be extended by one or more adjectives	
	Compose longer sentences orally before writing (multi clausal)	
	Proof read for errors in taught spelling, grammar and punctuation	
	Write a narrative about personal and others' experiences.	
	Form lower case letters of the correct size relative to one another.	
	Start using some of the diagonal and horizontal strokes needed to join letters and	
	understand which letters, when adjacent to one another, are best left unjoined	
	Spell and capitalise the months of the year	
	Spell and distinguish between there/their/they're, quite/quiet, bear/bare, too/two	
	Write words containing common suffixes: ment, less, er, est, y, ness, ful	
	Write sentences with different forms - statement, question, exclamation and	
	commands.	
	Use apostrophes for contractions	
	Write subordinating sentences using conjunctions; when, if, because, that	
	Use commas for items in a list	
	Use new vocabulary from their reading, discussion and from their wide experiences.	
	Write about read events	
	Write capital letters and digits of the correct size, orientation and relationship to	
	one another and to lower-case letters	
	Use spacing between words that reflects the size of the letters.	
Summer	Use ly adverbs in association with verbs	
	Spell many familiar words correctly and make phonetically plausible attempts at	
	others.	
	Spell many Year 2 homophones	
	Spell many Year 2 common exception words	
	Use apostrophes for singular possession	
	Use present tense and its progressive forms correctly and consistently.	
	Use past tense and its progressive forms correctly and consistently.	
	Write sentences mostly correctly demarcated with capital letters, full stops, question	
	marks and exclamation marks.	
	Write between 12 and 20 sentences in sequence for a range of purposes	
	Re-read to make sure their writing makes sense.	
	Write simple poetry.	
	Use diagonal and horizontal strokes needed to join some letters
